Technical notes

Nobile type (Soft cane) Dendrobiums

Nobile type Dendrobiums are those dendrobiums that grow actively during summer months and enter into a rest period during winter months.

Examples of commonly seen nobile type (Soft cane) dendrobiums in collections are: *Dendrobium nobile*, *Dendrobium friedericksianum*, *Dendrobium amosnum*, *Dendrobium pierardii* etc...

In Mauritius, these dendrobiums enter into the rest period during the month of June, July and August. The following point should be then observed:

No watering,

No feeding,

If the pseudobulbs shrivel, then a fine misting can be done around the plants.



Boisduval Scale -The ugly pest that can destroy and kill our plants.

Brief history of this insect:

The Boisduval Scale has been named by the entomologist Victor Antoine Signoret, to the honor of Mr. Boisduval who first recorded this specimen in the Orchid Greenhouse of “Jardin du Luxembourg” in Paris, France, in 1869. The scale is native from tropical America and has spread worldwide.

Boisduval scale can be seen mainly on Laeliine orchids (*Cattleyas*, *Laelia*, *Schomburgkias* etc...) and Oncidiine orchids (*Oncidiums*, *Odontoglossums* etc...).

Boisduval scale will seriously debilitate and kill an orchid if not controlled quickly.

A small anecdote: 7 Females of Boisduval were installed on a *Cattleya* and 5 month later, the population of scale was over 10,000.

Treatment:

Isolate infected plants.

If infection is not too severe, it can be treated with home-made solution, that is, 50:50 parts of rubbing alcohol and water, few drops of liquid soap (unperfume one) and ½ to 1 teaspoon of oil. Spray on infected plants.

Use of chemical insecticides such as: Mospilan, Malathion and Decis 2.5 EC (the later did work fine).
